- Thousands of volunteers for the Hotline, Social Media Monitoring, & Field Programs



About 866-OUR VOTE

- Voters can contact 866-OUR-VOTE 365 days a year to ask questions about the voting process or to report problems at the polls.
 - O Call
 - O Text
 - O Facebook Messenger
 - Webchat
- Trained legal volunteers man the hotline to support people at any stage in the voting process.
- More severe issues or calls that indicate systemic issues are escalated to our state partners command centers.

866-OUR-VOTE received 200,000+ calls in 2020 from all 50 states












Grassroots Volunteering



Patient Voting: How to Vote from the Hospital



A nonpartisan, non-profit program aiming to increase voter turnout of patients through emergency absentee processes









I just voted from my hospital bed!! I am deeply grateful for the energetic doc who helped me through this process and most of all that a program like this exists. 
Why Emergency Voting is Important

- According to the US Census, there are an average of 611,000 people in hospitals daily
- Who ends up in the hospital?
 - Patients experiencing chronic illness
 - Patients living with disabilities
- Low-income citizens in poor health are ~10% more likely to "cite sickness
 as an impediment to voting" compared to otherwise similar high-income
 citizens who are also in poor health




When our patients vote, campaigns are more likely to address their needs.

As our patients vote more often, they are labeled as likely voters and campaigns start contacting them, at which point a positive feedback loop begins to take shape.






Promising Indicators of Success: Income



Lower income clients and patients who were encouraged to vote by the nonprofit institution they received services from had the largest turnout advantage.


How does it work?



Emergency Absentee Processes Across the U.S. —ER



Every state has a different process!



Rhode Island



Emergency Voting begins: Oct. 15, 2024

Emergency Application due: Nov. 4, 2024, 4pm

Ballot due: Nov. 5, 2024, 8pm

Process: bipartisan delivery to hospital, or authorized agent (can be volunteer)

Who qualifies: ANYONE

Forms: available on B.O.E. website

Partners: Care N.E., Lifespan





A few states where ANYONE can use Emergency Voting

- Oregon
- California
- Rhode Island
- Washington
- Delaware



There is long-standing precedent and federal guidelines for voter engagement in 501(c)(3) spaces

501(C)(3) organizations may conduct nonpartisan voter engagement activities designed to help the public participate in elections:

- voter registration
- voter education
- get-out-the-vote (GOTV)

The National Voter Registration Act of 1993 actually encourages this type of non-partisan voter engagement in health centers!


