

### NONPARTISAN GOTV PHONEBANKING SCRIPT

\*\*USE THIS PHONEBANKING SCRIPT TO MAKE CALLS TO REGISTERED VOTERS.\*\*

### Introduction

Hello, am I speaking with [VOTER NAME]?

Hi, my name is [CALLER NAME] and I am with the National Low Income Housing Coalition. We're a nonpartisan organization encouraging renters in your community to make their voices heard in the upcoming elections on [ELECTION DATE]. How are you doing today? [Allow voter to respond, engage in conversation] Can we count on you to vote in the election?

[If yes]

Great, thanks for being a voter!

## [If no, skip to Voting Method]

I understand. I personally am voting in this election because... [example reason: our local, state, and federal leaders will make decisions about housing, transportation, schools, and other issues that affect our daily lives]. Are there any issues that are most important to you and your community? [Engage in conversation, and highlight the impact of voting on the issues they care about. If they end up wanting to make a voting plan, resume with the script. Otherwise, thank them for their time and encourage them to get involved with advocacy.]

[If yes, skip to Voting Method]

[If no, thank them for their time and wish them a great day]

### **VOTING METHOD**

Which method will you use to vote in this election: voting early, voting by mail, or voting in person on Election Day?

# [If voting early or in-person on Election Day]

That's great! Do you know where your polling place is located?

## [If yes, skip to next question]

[If no] You can visit ourhomes.turbovote.org/where-to-vote to find your polling place. Would you like me to help you look up your polling place right now? [If yes, ask them for their home address and search for their polling place. If they are uncomfortable sharing this information, you can repeat the URL and encourage them to ask a friend or family member to help them find the information.]

Do you know what date and time you plan to vote?

[If yes, skip to next section]

[If no] The early voting period is from [DATE RANGE] and polls are open from [POLLING PLACE HOURS]. You can find more information about your polling place hours at ourhomes.turbovote.org.

## [If voting by mail]

Great! Have you requested your ballot yet?

[If yes, skip to next question]

[If no] The deadline to request your mail-in ballot is DATE, so be sure to request it soon! You can find more information about how to vote by mail in your state at ourhomes.turbovote.org/vote-by-mail.

Do you know when you plan to return your ballot? Do you plan to mail it in, or to return it in a drop box?

[If they don't know, direct them to ourhomes.turbovote.org/vote-by-mail for information]

## [If unsure of voting method]

If you'd like to vote by mail, mail-in ballots must be requested
by DATE
and returned by DATE
If you'd like to vote in person, you can vote early from DATE
through DATE
If you'd like to vote in-person on Election Day on DATE,
polls are open from HOURS. You can find your polling place at
ourhomes turbovote org/where-to-vote

### **Additional Assistance**

Do you have transportation to your polling place?

[If yes, skip to next question]

[If no in AZ, CO, FL, GA, KY, NV, NC, OH, PA, TN, TX, VA, and WI] Rideshare2Vote Aware is an organization that can help you get a ride to the polls. You can call their hotline at 888.858.342. We can also share your contact information and they will follow up with you.

[In all other states, you can refer to local nonpartisan organizations that are offering rides to the polls. Lyft will also offer discounted one-way rides to the polls on Election Day.]

[make a note if they need to be connected with Rideshare2Vote Aware or another nonpartisan voter transportation service.]

In states with voter ID requirements: In [STATE], voters must bring an ID to the polls. [Describe voter ID requirement.] Do you need help getting a voter ID?

[If yes] You can visit https://www.voteriders.org/freehelp/ or call 866-ID-2-VOTE for free assistance with getting a voter ID. We can also share your contact information with our partners at VoteRiders and they will follow up with you.

[If no] Thank you for being a voter and making your voice heard in this election! I encourage you to help a friend or family member make their voting plan, too! ## **RESPONSES TO POTENTIAL FAQS FROM VOTERS**

- How did you get this number?
  - o We're reaching out to people who are registered to vote in **[STATE]** according to the state election office.
- Which candidate/party are you supporting?
  - o Our organization is nonpartisan, meaning we don't support any candidate or political party. We're encouraging renters to turn out to vote, no matter who they vote for.
- I don't support [political candidate name] or None of the candidates represent my values.
  - o I understand. This election isn't just about the presidential/congressional elections—there are a lot of important offices down the ballot that don't get as much attention, and [if applicable] there are ballot measures, which allow you to make direct decisions about policies affecting your community. Can I help you make a plan to vote in your state and local elections?

- My vote doesn't matter/Politicians don't care about me and my community.
  - o I understand, and I know there are a lot of people who feel the same way. Too often, our elected officials don't listen to renters and don't make policies that serve our communities. Voting is a first step to making a change. If we all turn out to vote, we can push our leaders to listen to our communities and prioritize the issues we care about.
